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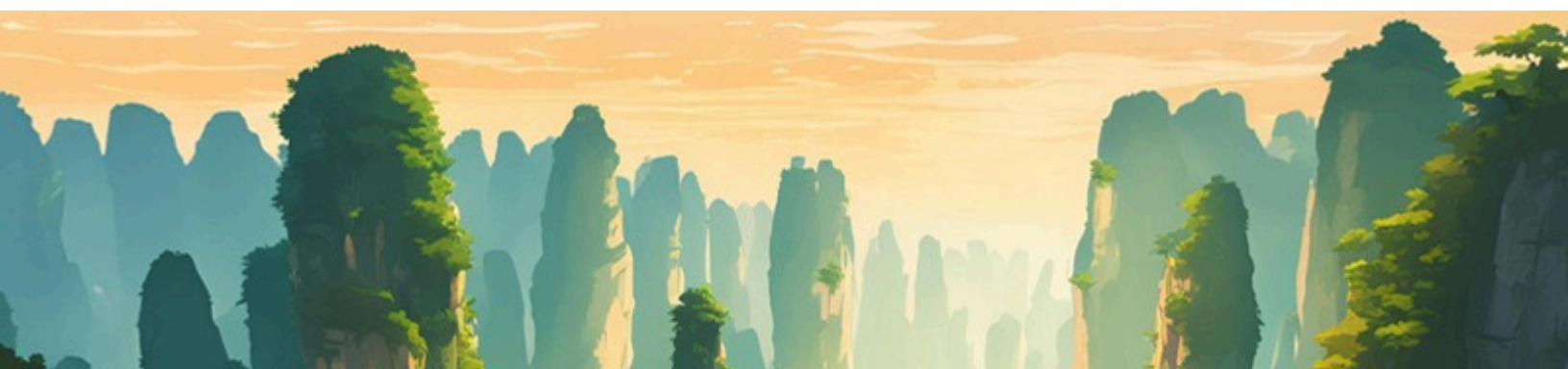
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Welcome!

And all the trees of the field will clap their hands.

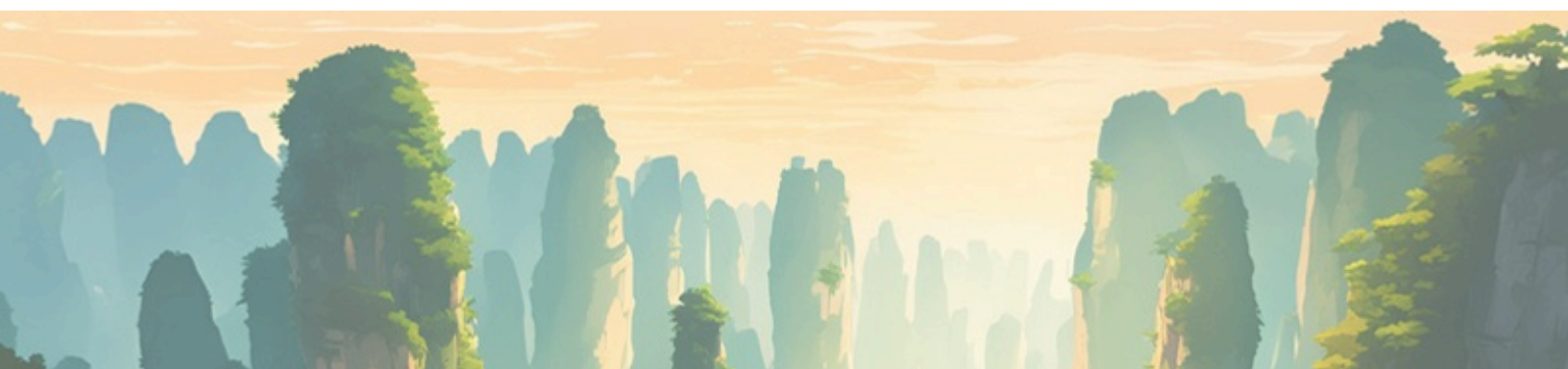

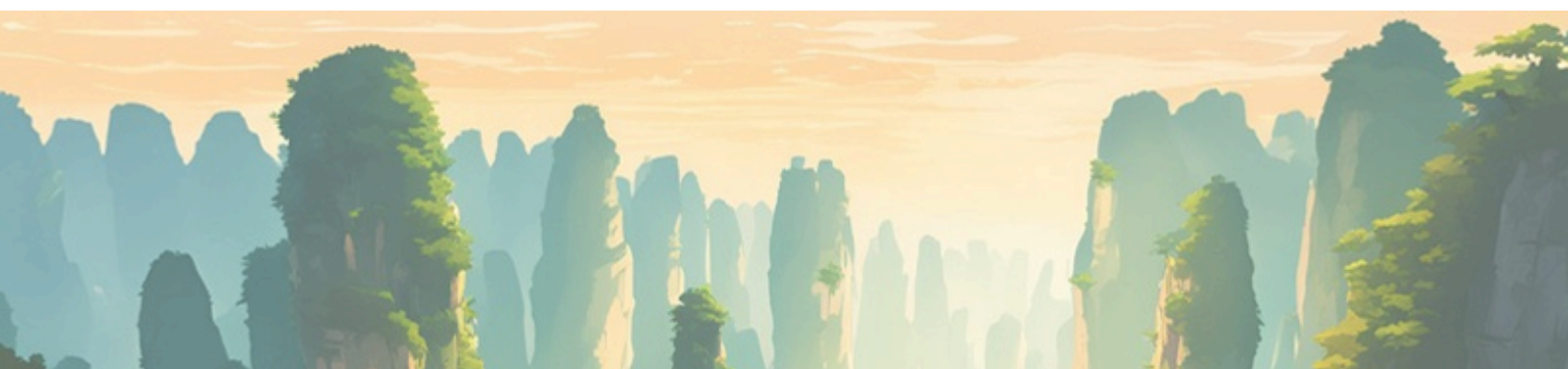

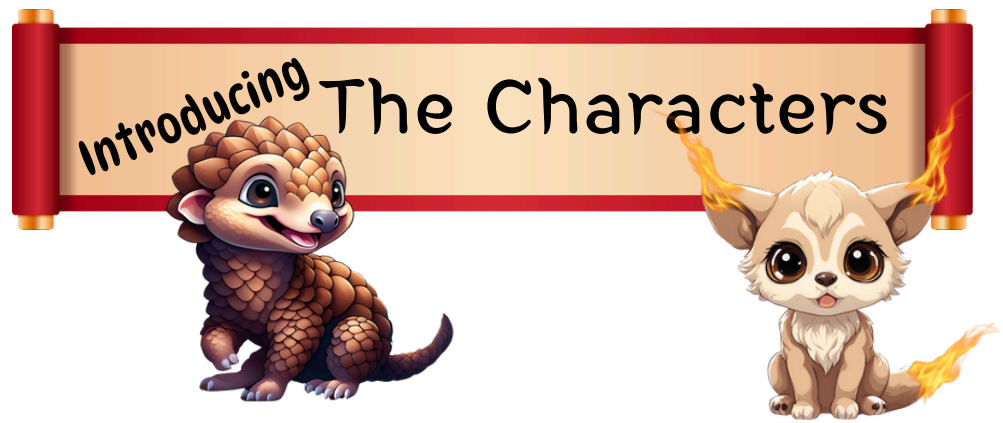
Forming Tribes

Divide participants into Tribes made up of mixed-age children. Each Tribe can include up to seven children, with one adult or an older child as the Tribe Leader. Including older children alongside younger ones creates natural opportunities for leadership, encouragement, and teamwork.

Throughout Soaring Peaks, Tribes journey together through a shared adventure inspired by the Hallelujah Mountains of China. Tribe names help bring the experience to life and build group identity. Suggestions include:

- Pandas
- Snow Leopards
- Tigers
- Cranes
- Monkeys
- Red Pandas





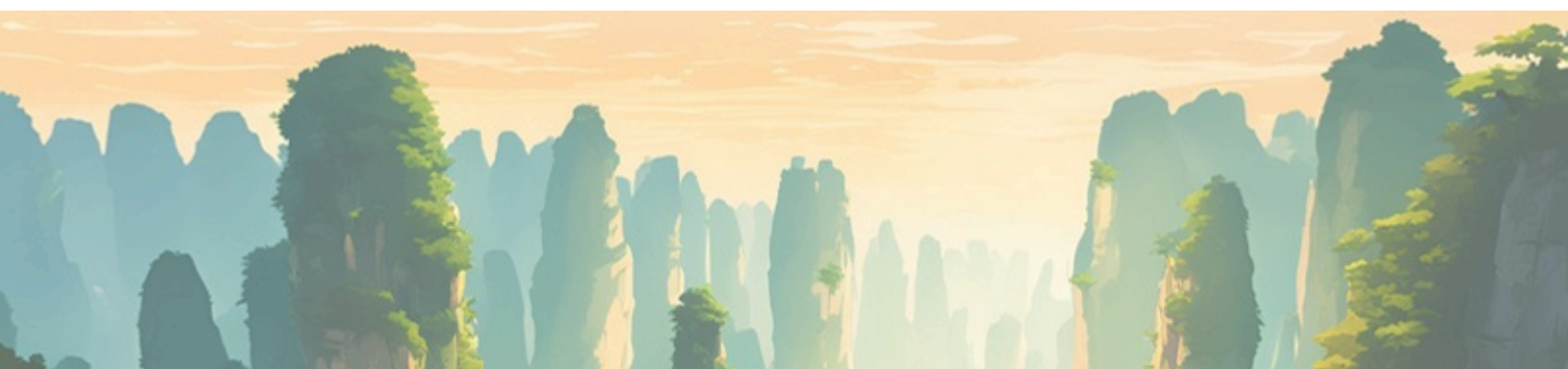
The stories of Soaring Peaks are brought to life through a small group of animal characters inspired by real wildlife found in China's mountainous regions. These characters help children engage the lessons in age-appropriate, imaginative ways while always pointing beyond themselves to Jesus.

Christ-Centered Focus




Every story, activity, and reflection in Soaring Peaks is designed to point children to Jesus. While creativity and imagination are used to engage young hearts, Jesus Christ remains the center of every lesson, prayer, and experience.

- Pangoleo – A thoughtful pangolin who reminds children that even quiet, overlooked lives matter deeply to God. Pangoleo's stories help children see how Jesus values every person and calls us to trust Him.
- Bulah – A gentle and steady companion who models patience, kindness, and faithfulness. Through Bulah, children learn that following Jesus shapes how we treat others.
- Jia – A joyful panda who discovers that everyday gifts can be used for God's purposes. Jia's journey helps children recognize how Jesus brings joy and meaning to ordinary life.
- Daiyu – A snow leopard cub learning courage during uncertain moments. Daiyu's story encourages children to rely on Jesus when they feel afraid or unsure.

Each character's story connects directly to Scripture. It helps children understand how Jesus invites us to live with peace, joy, courage, and love.










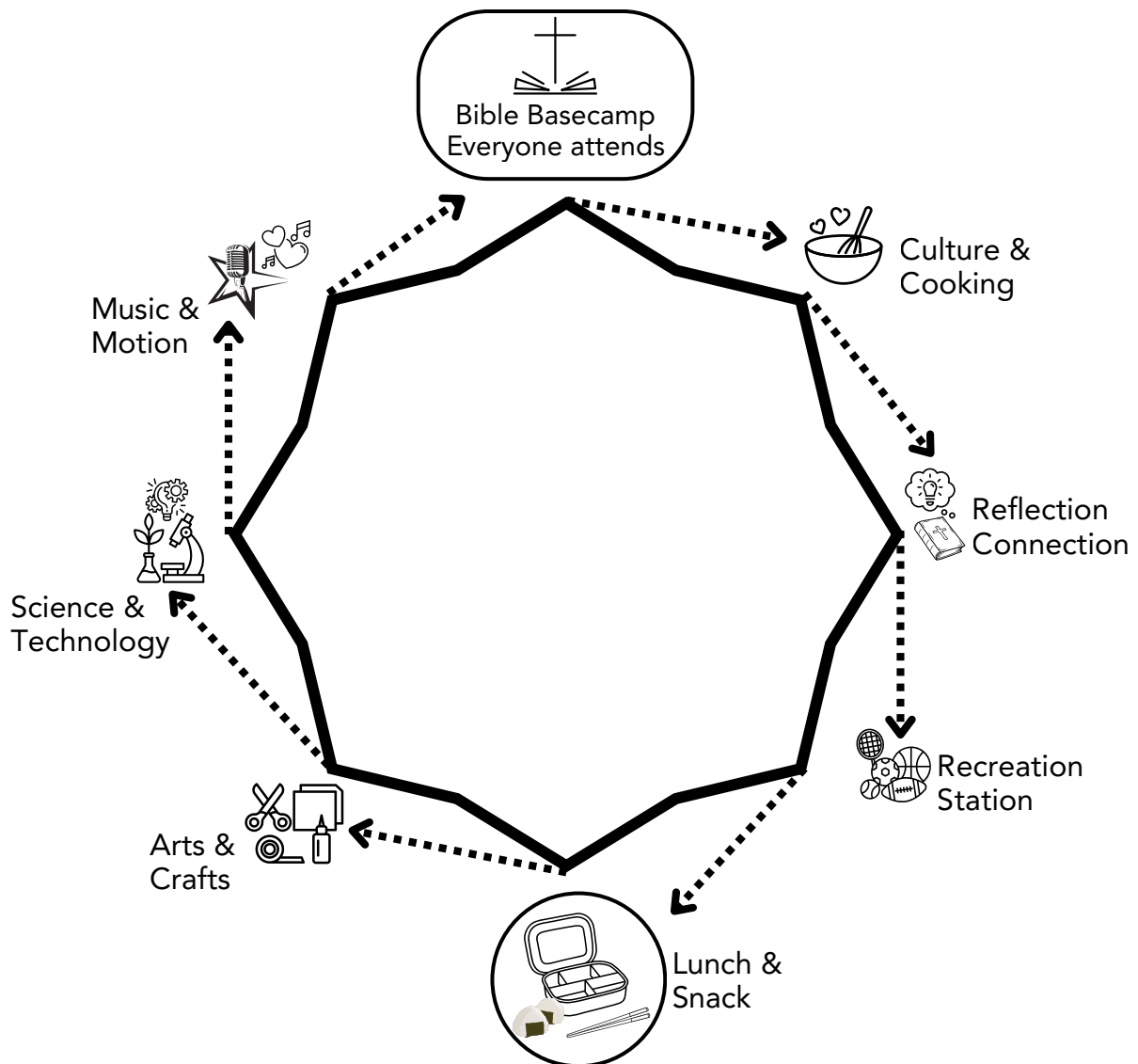

Rotation Stations

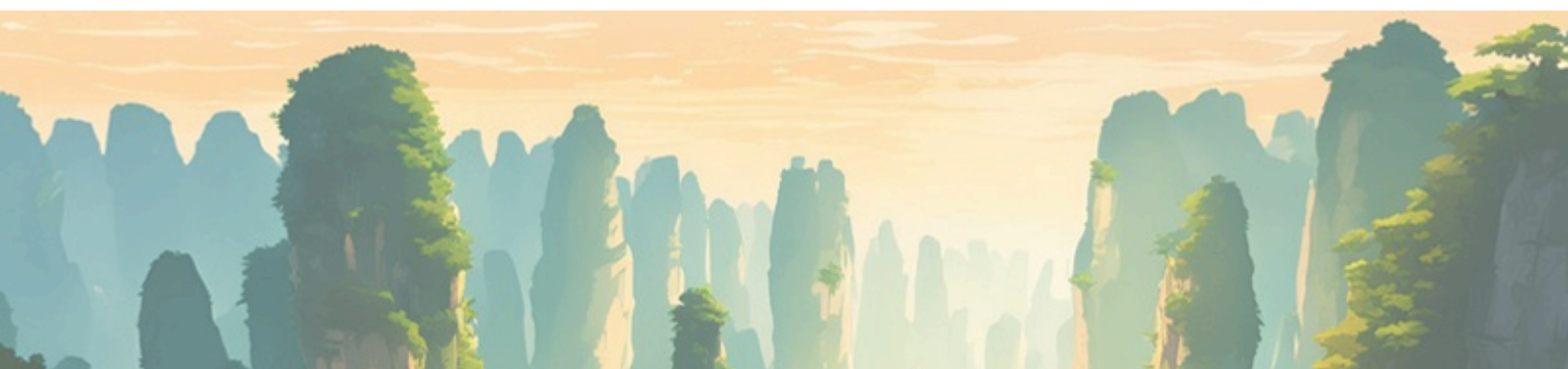

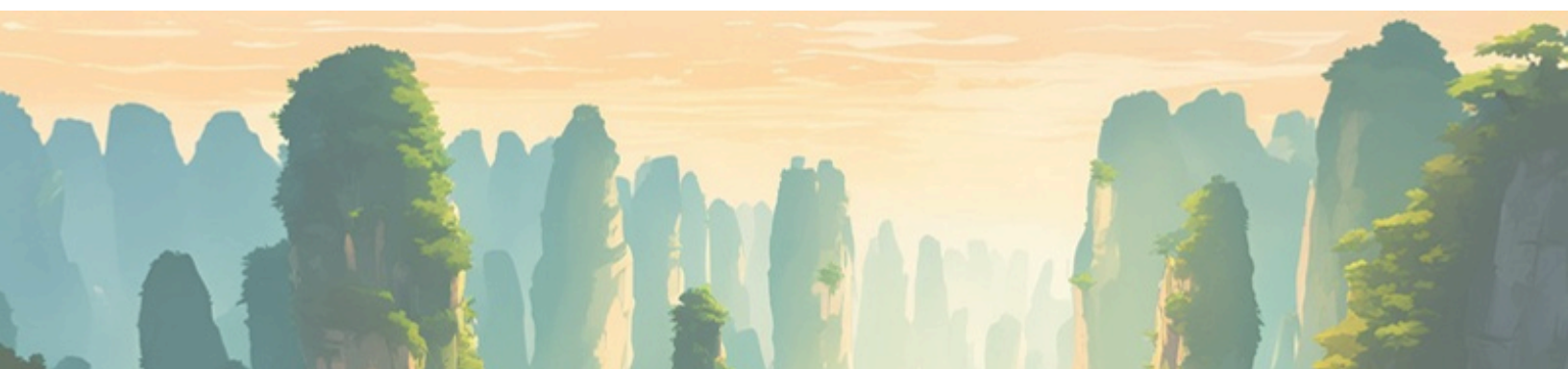

Flexible Formats

One-Room or Backyard VBS

Stations are easy to create with folding tables or mats/blankets on the floor/grass. Even if there are only a few kids, it is still highly recommended to have at least 1 extra person on hand in addition to the Tribe Leaders to help with setting up each station between visits. Rotate as a group from one experience to the next, spending as much or little time at each activity as your group needs.

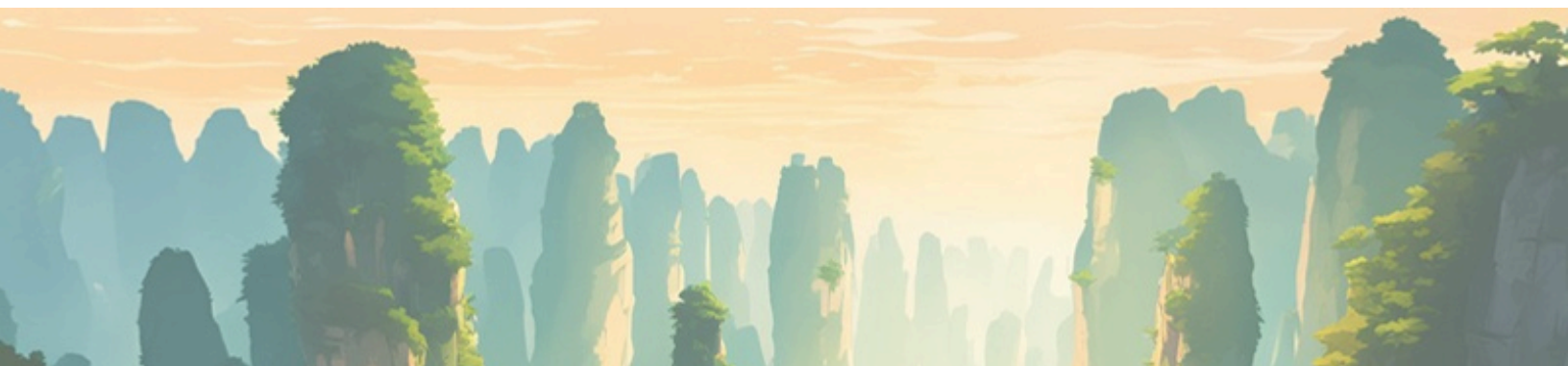
Small Churches

We've got you! This VBS was written for a group of 20-40 students attending. **FUN FACT:** the first VBS that Ana-Genesis created was for 9 kids in the middle of the COVID-19 pandemic. The students are going to have a blast as they explore the world of the Hallelujah Mountains of China with the KĩnMĩn. Here are some tips to help you have a great VBS:

- Keep It Simple Saints! Work within the resources God has given. Set up as many or as few stations as you need for your group.
- Consider hosting your VBS:
 - on a weekend or consecutive Saturdays
 - after church on Sunday. This allows families to participate as a group and helpers are often more readily available on weekends.
 - It's totally possible to use this VBS as Curriculum for Student Ministry on Sundays! Simply adjust the number of stations for the length of time you have. For example, if your Student Ministry runs for 1 hour, choose 2 stations plus the Bible Basecamp (each station takes about 20 minutes)

Larger Groups

Groups of up to 80 kids or more can host a KĩnMĩn VBS program! Just duplicate the stations as needed. It's a good idea to allow no more than 2 Tribes at each station (14 kids plus Leaders to help) at a time.





BaseCamp 1

Say a short prayer at the beginning and end of each session

1.1 Bible BaseCamp: Matthew 13:3-9 The Sower and the Seed

Once upon a time, in a sunny little village in China, there was a kind farmer named Uncle Li. Uncle Li loved planting seeds and watching them grow. But he wasn't just any farmer—he also loved teaching the village children about God's love through the lessons he learned in the fields.

One bright morning, Uncle Li gathered the children around him. "Today," he said, "I'm going to plant seeds in my field. But as I work, I want you to watch and see what happens to the seeds. Each seed has a special lesson to teach us about growing in God's love."

The children nodded eagerly and followed Uncle Li as he began his work.

Uncle Li reached into his bag and scattered some seeds on the path near the field. The children saw birds swoop down almost immediately. "Chirp, chirp!" they sang as they gobbled up the seeds.

"Why did the seeds disappear so quickly?" asked a little boy named Xiaobo.

"Oh no!" cried Lin Yue. "The plants didn't have a chance!"

Uncle Li nodded. "These seeds remind us of people who want to grow in God's love but let worries or wanting too many things get in the way. The thorns are like distractions that choke their faith."

Finally, Uncle Li walked to a soft, rich soil patch and scattered his seeds there. The children waited and watched. Day by day, little sprouts grew taller and stronger until they became golden stalks of grain. The plants were healthy and full of seeds.

"Wow!" said Xiaobo. "These seeds did the best of all!"

"That's right," Uncle Li said. "These seeds remind us of people who hear about God's love, take it into their hearts, and live it out daily. Their faith strengthens and helps others, just like these plants will feed our village."

2.1 Mark 4: 35:41 Jesus Calms the Storm

Session 3: Luke 9:39-45 Jesus on the Mountain

Luke 9:28-36 – The Transfiguration (Expanded for Children)

One day, Jesus told three of His disciples—Peter, James, and John—to come with Him up a high mountain. They didn't know why Jesus wanted to climb the mountain, but they followed Him. It was a long and tiring walk, and by the time they reached the top, they were feeling very sleepy.

But while they were up there, something amazing happened!

As Jesus was praying, His face suddenly changed. It became bright, shining like the sun. Even His clothes turned dazzling white, glowing as bright as a flash of lightning. The disciples had never seen anything like this before!

Reflection Connection 1

1.2 Reflection Connection: Jia Finds Joy (Matthew 13:3-9)

Deep in the lush, green forest of China, a panda named Jia munched on her favorite food—bamboo. She munched and crunched from sunrise to sunset. But lately, Jia had been feeling unhappy. "Is this all I ever do?" she sighed one day, staring at a lush stalk of bamboo. "Eat and eat and eat. I don't have any other skills besides eating and climbing trees. I don't feel very special." As Jia plopped down in the shade, her big panda belly full, a friendly voice called out from the nearby stream. "Why the long face, Jia?" Jia turned to see Lu-Kai, the wise Giant Chinese Salamander, peering at her from the other side of the stream. His gentle eyes sparkled as he climbed onto a rock. "Oh, Lu-Kai," Jia said, resting her chin on her paw. "All I ever do is eat. Other animals run fast, fly high, or build amazing things. But me? I just munch bamboo all day. What good is that?" Lu-Kai chuckled. "Oh, Jia, don't you know? What you do is very important!" Jia tilted her head. "It is?" "Yes!" Lu-Kai exclaimed. "Let me tell you something wonderful. "But how can something so ordinary—like eating, rolling, and pooping—be so important?" she asked.

Lu-Kai smiled kindly. "Let me share something from the Bible," he said. "In John 15:9-11, Jesus reminds us that when we live in His love and do what we're made to do, our joy will be full. You see, Jia, you're doing exactly what God created you to do. And that makes you special!" Jia felt her heart lift. This is "Yúzé" (玉泽). Generally, his name translates to "goodness, kindness," and denotes wisdom. It is pronounced "YOO-ZUH"

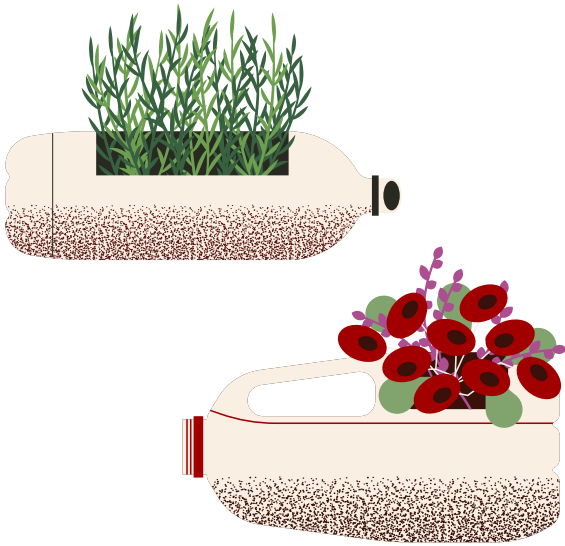

Milk Jug Garden

EARTH SCIENCE PHYSICS ENGINEERING

PREP: 15 MINUTES;

TEACH: 15-20 Minutes



Materials For The Experiment

- 1/2 Gallon Milk Jug or similar plastic bottle
- Potting soil or dirt
- 2 cups of water
- grass, leaves and twigs
- an empty pan to catch the water
- Seeds for catnip, small herbs or small flowers

Steps

1. Cut openings in each bottle and fill them with soil or dirt. Remove the lid.
2. In one bottle add a layer of tiny broken twigs, small leaves and dry grass.
3. Place the jug in the pan and tilt it with the opening lower than the back. SLOWLY pour 1/2 cup of water in each
4. Observe the difference. Did the twigs, leaves and grass block the hole and prevent soil from leaving?
5. Repeat STEP 3 but pour the water FAST. What is the difference?

Add seeds to the moistened soil and place both jugs in a sunny place. Once the seeds have sprouted, water each mini garden according to the directions on the seed packet. This makes a great take-home item for students.

Teaching Point:

Ask the audience: If I fill this jug with water what will happen to the soil?

During the Experiment:

Soil erosion occurs when the topmost layer of earth is exposed to the wind and rain. As water and wind connect with the bare soil, the richest part is washed or blown away. Trees, shrubs and grass play a vital role in preventing soil erosion and maintaining high levels of precious nutrients so that everything in the ecosystem can flourish. In our story today Jia, the little Panda, thought that she wasn't very important but biodiversity, that means all the unique things in an ecosystem, was created by God and everything matters.

Keep Learning!

Can the students keep their gardens alive long enough to produce flowers or edibles? Share the results over the coming weeks.

Storm Basin



ATMOSPHERIC SCIENCE | PHYSICS. | ENGINEERING
PREP: 15 MINUTES;
TEACH: 15-20 Minutes

Materials For The Experiment

- sheets of colored paper
- Large basin filled about 1/3 with water
- Hair Dryer (with different speed settings)

Steps

1. Hand out sheets of colored paper to students.
2. Have the kids fold the paper into boat shapes. Some might know how to make an origami boat while others might just crumple the paper (as shown). Let them use their own creativity it will produce more interesting results.
3. Place all the boats in the basin of water and see which designs float
4. Using a hair dryer on the lowest setting, gently cause small waves. Which boats still float?
5. Increase the speed of the wind and get closer to the boats. What happens?



Teaching Point:

Ask the audience: If I blow air on the water, will the boats turn over or will they float?

During the Experiment:

The fishing boat that Jesus and the apostles were on was in danger of capsizing. The waves and wind were too strong. Using this hair dryer at different speeds we can see that the amount of wind makes a difference. They needed some wind to sail the boat but too much could cause a terrible accident and maybe people would drown. In our story today Jesus showed that he is the Lord of all Creation - even the winds and waves obeyed

Keep Learning!

Can the students design a paper boat that can withstand a lot of wind. Let them practice making different kinds of boats during free-play time.

Bamboo Flutes

PHYSICS | ENGINEERING

PREP: 5 MINUTES;

TEACH: 15-20 Minutes

Materials For The Experiment

- bamboo straws
- brown paper tape & a little water to moisten it
- strong scissors
- Optional* a bamboo flute, Sheng or other instruments made of bamboo

Steps

1. Hand out 5-6 bamboo straws per student
2. Have the students carefully cut the straws in different lengths
3. Place the straws on a flat surface organizing them from the longest to the shortest
4. Cut the strong brown paper tape long enough to wrap around all the straws
5. Moisten the tape and stick the straws together firmly. While it is drying, share the teaching points.
6. In a few minutes the flutes are ready to play! Try making different sounds.

Teaching Point:

Ask the audience: If I blow air on the water, will the boats turn over or will they float?

During the Experiment:

2. Let each student choose 2 mini Oreo cookies and some broken pieces
3. Hand out cupcakes and decorations
4. Let the kids have fun decorating their Panda Cupcakes! The best part is they can eat them!

Teaching Point:

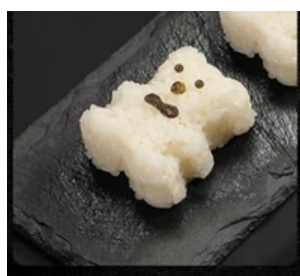
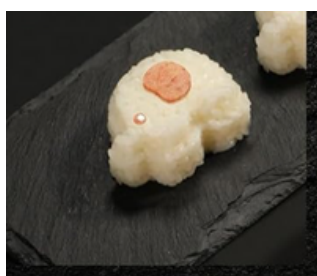
Do you know about Pandas? They are really cute and very important. They are also an endangered species.

PREP: 5 MINUTES;

TEACH: 15 Minutes

Ingredients & Materials

- Sticky Rice
- Small Plates and Bowls
- Rice Molds
- Sesame seeds (black and normal), tiny veggie bits such as carrot, red pepper, seaweed for decorations

Steps

- 1 Prepare small bowls with sesame seeds, seaweed pieces, and tiny vegetable pieces
2. Hand out a paper plate to each student
3. Let each student choose a mold to use or shape the rice with their hands (remember to wash first!)
4. Let the kids have fun making and decorating their rice animals. The most fun might be eating them!



Teaching Point:

Today we learned about Jesus calming a storm at sea. The people were very scared but Jesus was there to rescue them. He cares deeply about all the animals, the fish and people.

During the Cooking:

Several of the Apostles were fishermen and their fathers had boats. Have you ever been on a boat? What was it like? Have you ever been to a fish market? What are some of your favorite sea creatures? Can you make one from rice?

PREP: 45 MINUTES;

TEACH: 15 Minutes

Ingredients & Materials

- Dumpling/Gyoza/Mandu Wrappers (round)
- Filling: Stir fried bamboo shoots and veggies divided into bowls
- Water and rice starch
- Optional *purchased dumpling maker

Steps

- 1 Hand out a paper plate, wrappers and filling to to each student
2. *Optional: hand out dumpling molds/makers to younger students
3. Teach how to make Mandu/Gyoza/Dumplings using the instructions
4. Enjoy!

Method



1. Place a small amount of filling in the center of a wrapper.



2. Use a little water to moisten the edges of the wrapper



3. Carefully pleat the wrapper as you close it.

4. Steam, fry or boil and enjoy!

Materials: chairs, pylons, skipping ropes, bean bags, 2 hula hoops

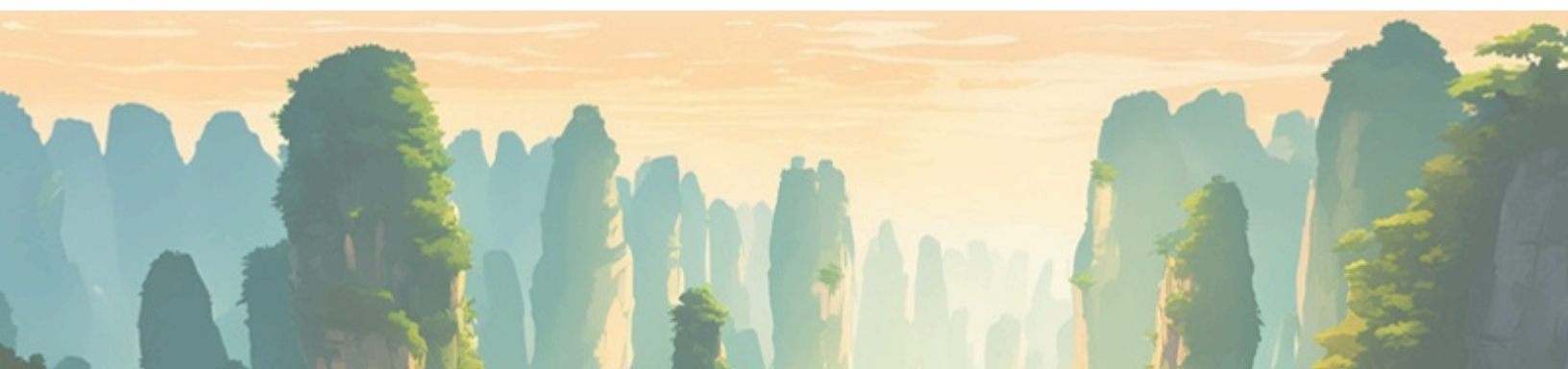

Day 2: Jesus Said - A Wave Game

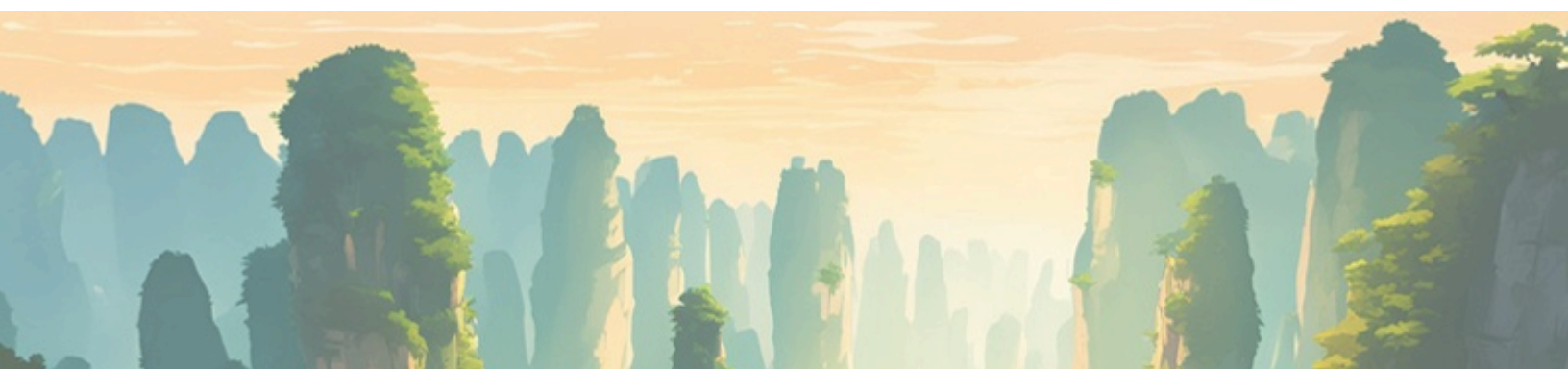
Set up time: 1-2 minutes

Set up time: 15 minutes

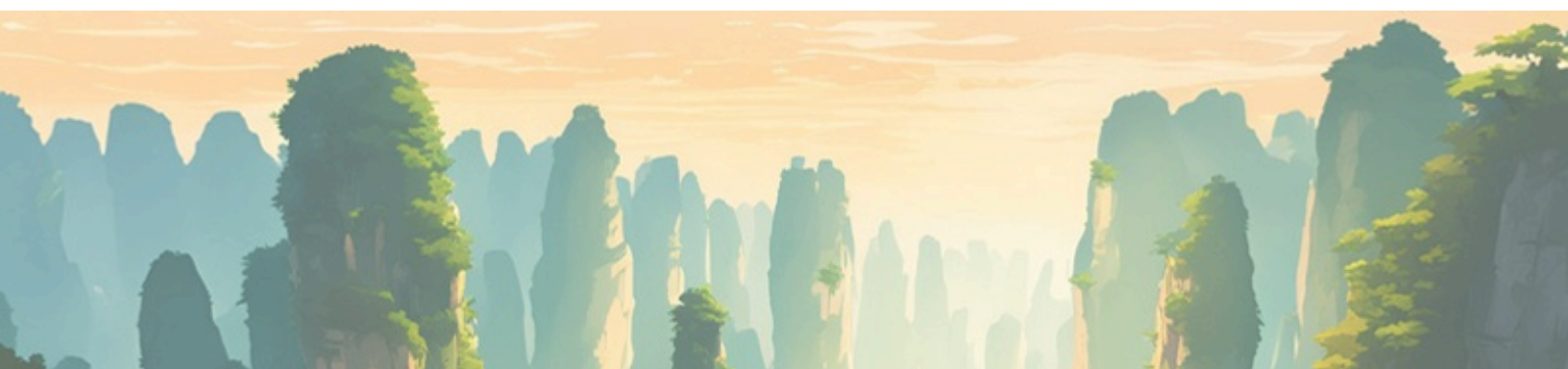
Materials: You will need the small lanterns from the previous crafts and a few extras. Also some tape or coat hangers

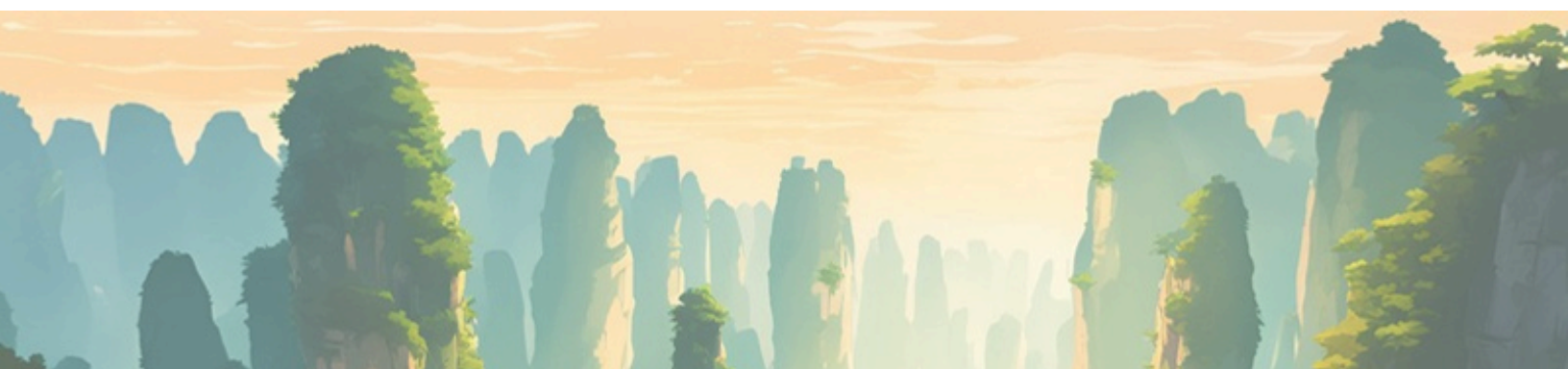

Mark 4:35-41

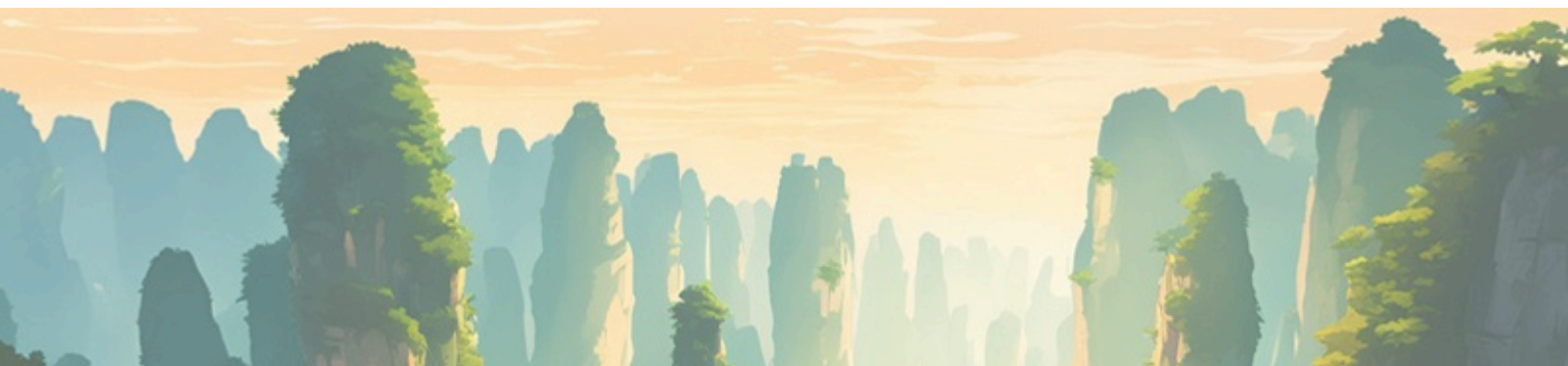

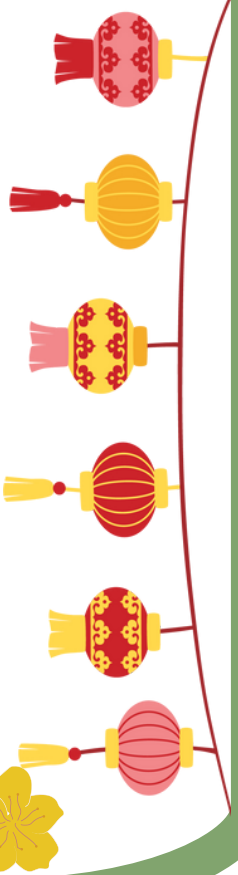
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
